ST COLUMBA HOTEL

Comfortable sun lounges and restaurant provide glorious panoramic views, in ever changing colours, over the

Originally built as a Manse in 1846 and since extended, the hotel stands on rising ground next to Iona Abbey and

less than a quarter of a mile from the jetty.

The accommodation for 47 people consists of single, double and twin rooms, all with en-suite bath or shower. Three can be used as family rooms.

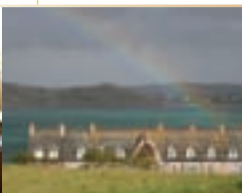
The hotel has a Restricted Hotel Licence, which enables us to serve wine and spirits to our residents, and to non-residents with meals.

ISLE OF IONA

This famous Inner Hebridean island, only three miles long by a mile and a half wide, is separated by the narrow Sound of Iona from Fionnphort, which is located at the south western tip of Mull. A passenger ferry runs between Fionnphort and Iona and takes approximately five minutes.

Even before the Christian era, Iona was considered to be a place of special spiritual significance – there are said to have been over 300 standing stones on the island. Today it is most famous for the coming of the passionate and renegade St. Columba from Ireland in 563AD. The Saint founded a small Celtic monastery here, and for 34 years, carried on his work of introducing Christianity to the Scottish mainland and as far south as Switzerland, until his death in 597AD.

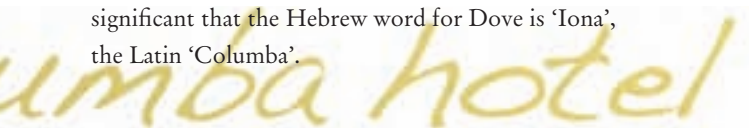


The Benedictine Abbey was built in the 12th Century, but fell into ruin after the Reformation. The buildings have now been restored, principally by the 'Iona Community', who have a permanent residence in the Abbey.

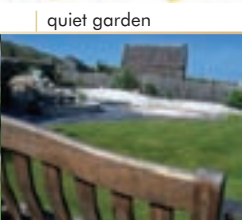
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'IONA' & 'COLUMBA'

There are many explanations of the origin of the word Iona, and some think it is derived from I-shona, the Blessed or sacred Isle. However, it is curiously significant that the Hebrew word for Dove is 'Iona', the Latin 'Columba'.

With spectacular views across the Sound of Iona to the Ross of Mull and beyond, we are confident that we provide an exceptional eating experience.

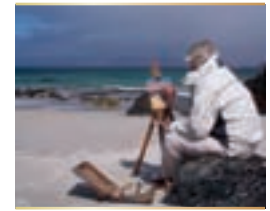
CHILDREN

ACTIVITIES

The island is really its own 'activity'. There are endless different walks to places of legendary or actual fame.



Bird-watching, the study of wild flowers and geology occupy the time of many visitors. However, the island offers the greatest facilities for doing absolutely nothing in complete peace and quiet, and if necessary, in solitude.

The hotel has no television. A perfect haven for relaxation and tranquillity and, with the lack of cars, children do not have to be so closely guarded.

BOAT TRIPS

Local boats sail twice daily to the Isle of Staffa where you will find Fingal's Cave.



Wildlife including whales, dolphins, porpoise, basking sharks, seal pups, puffins and many other sea birds are often sighted on these trips.

There is also a small skippered sailing boat which can be chartered for alternative boat trips and fishing trips. Bookings for boat trips can be made through the hotel.

EXPLORING

Within walking distance is a wonderful choice of beaches, mainly of white sand, others with multi-coloured



pebbles and shells – it is hard to leave the island without a pocketful of small treasures.

Expect to enjoy sand dunes, rock pools, beach-combing and excellent swimming, when the sun shines, in crystal clear turquoise water. Packed lunches may be ordered in advance and bikes are available to hire on the island.



GOLF

There is a 'natural' 18-hole golf course on the Machair beside the sea. Greens are kept cropped by sheep. Green fees are by donation.

Part of Iona's majesty is the weather. Bring suitable footwear for walking and all weather clothing!

Cars are not allowed on Iona except with a permit. There is ample free parking at Fionnphort beside the Columba Centre. The hotel is a short walk from the jetty. We can pick up and deliver your luggage to ferries if requested – please call us when you know which ferry you will be on.

Guests with their own wireless-enabled laptops can make use of the hotel's wireless internet facility. We also have an internet room which is free of charge for residents.
